Northwest Georgia Trade and Convention Center



The Northwest Georgia Trade and Convention Center has a distinctive setting in the foothills of the historic high country of Georgia's Blue Ridge Mountains. Located less than a mile off Interstate 75 in historic Dalton, GA, the Dalton Trade Center is just 30 miles south of Chattanooga, TN and 90 miles north of Atlanta, GA.

Among the 143,000 square foot facility are 2 exhibit halls, 2 banquet halls, 9 meeting rooms, a 230 seat lecture hall theatre, and an executive board room. Whether you're looking for a room for a 15 person meeting or a 1500 person convention, the Northwest GA Trade Center has the space to fit your needs.

The Northwest Georgia Trade and Convention Center has over 850 hotel rooms within a 2-mile radius. Nearby activities include hiking in the gorgeous Blue Ridge Mountains, golfing at some beautiful courses, or just taking a stroll through downtown to visit some of the many shops and restaurants in the area.
