








Member Spotlight


Submitted by Tom Hite:

The purpose of this newsletter is to help you through the process of registering for the convention.

When you signed up for our newsletter, it assigned you a logon (your e-mail address) and a random password. That password was e-mailed to you via secure e-mail; and you may change it anytime you desire.

To register for the convention, you will need to log onto our website with your password during registration. If you don't know your password, you will need to click on the "Forgot password" button, and an e-mail will be sent to you allowing you to enter a new password. You can then reset your password using the link in the e-mail. Use your e-mail and password to register for the convention.

We found out today that the DoubleTree hotel will not have our rooms reserved for our convention at convention rates until the latter part of September. So to be sure you get the discount rates, we are delaying opening hotel reservations until September 30, 2018. At that time you can either call the hotel or reserve online.

Registration Procedure

It is a good idea to print this e-mail so you can follow the steps on your computer without looking back at the screen with this e-mail.

To register:

- 1. Click on the "Registration" menu item.
- 2. Click on the "Attendee" sub-menu item.
- 3. Within the page that is presented, click on either "Individual" or "Family" depending on whether you are coming by yourself, or have family members attending the convention with you.
- 4. If you haven't yet logged in:
- 5. The screen "Please login to continue" will be displayed. You log in using the same method you used to set up your account to receive newsletters and emails like this. That would be with Facebook, Google, or the specific e-mail address you provided when setting up your account.

If you don't remember your password:

- 1. Click on "Forgot Password" and you will receive an e-mail with your password. You can change your password after you receive the e-mail by following the instructions in the e-mail.
- 2 Reset your password and confirm it.
- 3. Return to "Registration" "Attendee" "Family" or "Individual"
- 4. Enter your e-mail and password. Click "Log in".
- 5. If this is the first time you have logged in after setting up your account, the "2019 NGRC Rules and Terms" page appears. Read and click on the "I agree" button. Click "Continue".
- 6. The Registration page will be displayed. Click "Register" at the bottom of the page.
- 7. The next page tells you if you are registering Family or Individual and fills in your e-mail. Click "Next".
- Fill out the registration form. If you are registering as a family, and you have more than 4 members in your family attending the convention, please contact the Registrar via e-mail after you have registered to add their names. The Registrar e-mail address is 2019ngrcregistrar@rcgrs.com.
- 1. After making all the selections you want, click "Next".
- 2. The "Review and Confirm" screen will be presented. Click on "Pay online" to pay with a credit card. Fill out your credit card information. A picture will come up and you will need to verify you are not a robot. (We know you aren't a robot,

but that is software we can't change.) Click the "Pay \$xxx.xx (USD)" button (the "\$xxx.xx" will be the total amount due and to be charged to your credit card).

A recap of what you have paid for is the next screen. If you want to make any changes in your registration, or to cancel your registration, please contact our Registrar via this e-mail address: <u>2019ngrcregistrar@rcgrs.com</u>. If you want a return phone call, please include your phone number in your e-mail.

- 1. You will receive an e-mail confirmation detailing what you have ordered. Please bring this with you to the convention. It will make things go smoother when you arrive and pick up your Convention Bag at the Registration Desk.
- 2. If you do not wish to pay by credit card, Click "Invoice me" instead of "Pay now".
- 3. The invoice of all items ordered will appear. You will get an e-mail with this invoice. Please print the e-mail and mail with your check. Events are not reserved for you until payment is received. We will notify you if an event which you have ordered is full. 

The LP&W has a thousand feet of track divided into four loops, with another ninety feet of storage track in the shed. We run NCE DCC track power. Twenty two wooden bridges cross two rivers connecting three ponds and two dry river beds. I replaced the last temporary aluminum bridge with a covered bridge last year. Two mountains with fifty feet of trestle complete the lay-out.

Bring chairs and a picnic lunch, and a train to run. Paul will provide soft drinks and water.

The layout was designed for 1:29 scale rolling stock - clearances will not allow most 1:20.3 to run. Battery power, only. Sharpest curves are 12.5' diameter with #6 turnouts. Mainline grades are 2%.

This layout is patterned after the South Fork Division of the Southern Railway in the Lake Cumberland area of Kentucky, and depicts the Southern Railway as it would have appeared near the end of the steam era (circa 1945).

There is 300' of main-line and 6 stub sidings, a crossover between double tracks, and a passing siding. The layout is set up for multiple train switching operations

April 6th - Fun Run at Tom & Gloria's House. Located at 23379 Superior Ave Port Charlotte. The Tropical RR hours will be 11:00 to 4:00. Bring your own lunch. Soda and water will be provided. The TRR has 400' of main line track with 20' diameter curves so

bring on the Big Boys. The switching yard has 7 tracks for plenty of storage. All switches are #6. Battery power only.

May 4th— Fun Run at Charlie Bealls. Charlie said the layout is roughly 70 feet x 90 feet and has four train track lines. It was built in 2006. There is a waterfall, water feature, stocked with fish, long truss bridges, and as the pictures show a varied, beautifully landscaped terrain throughout the layout . Also...we have two videos of his layout on our closed to members only <u>Group Florida Garden Railway Facebook page</u>. If you haven't joined yet.....sign up, it's free as part of your membership, and you'll see great Garden Railway pictures and videos from members.

The meet starts at noon, bring a dish to share, and chairs.


