

It's always an enjoyable day at Charlie's spectacular Garden Railway layout! Bring chairs and a picnic lunch, and a train to run. Charlie will provide soft drinks and water. The layout is roughly 70 feet x 90 feet, and has four mainlines. Including sidings, there is about 1200 feet of track. It was built in 2006 and has been featured in Garden Railways magazine. There is a waterfall, koi pond, long truss bridges, and a varied, beautifully landscaped terrain throughout the layout. Charlie has 20 locomotives and 111 cars.

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Then at 2PM, (on the same day) Mike and Tracy Walls will open up their layout, the "Cobblestone Railroad", for their "golden spike" run, the first since they moved to Florida! Their home is at:



Information Resources for Large Scale

As disappointed as I am with the way Garden Railways magazine dumped us of the Garden Railway Community, I have continued to watch for signs of enthusiasm for Garden Railroading at Kalmbach. If you go to Trains.com and look at articles you will see a very nice little collection of Large Scale Project articles, available for free download. I haven't kept track, but the last time I opened and downloaded an article there, it went well, but I was warned – "You have 7 free views remaining. Click here to learn about the Unlimited Membership!" – (I didn't buy an Unlimited Membership, but you might like to – more about that later). You will notice that Kalmbach is still listing Garden Railways magazine as one of their lines, and they have now begun posting some new garden railroading project articles.

When you first open Trains.com, the master website for the Kalmbach line of products, you will see a section titled "Popular Articles". You may see an article heading there titled "Projects – Garden Railways". If not, click on the Projects heading, and find where the Garden Railways projects are. If you find an article you'd like to have, as I mentioned, I don't know how many articles you get for free, or whether the number starts over every year, or what. You can download or print the articles, but if you merely hit the "print" button in your browser, you will print some buttons and pop-ups from their website as well as the article, and it will not fill the page correctly. The best way to download one is to hit "print" in your browser, then select "Save as PDF", select the print page range you want (you can eliminate a page or two of ads that follows the article), navigate to a folder you want to keep it in, and hit "Save". Then you can open the PDF and print it from there if you like.

Notice also, if you first hit the "Garden Railways" tab on the Trains.com website homepage, then hit "Beginners", there is a button there for "Free Downloads". There are all sorts of nice articles, videos, and photos to use for reference or wallpaper there.

If you'd like to get their free "Newsletters" about Garden Railways article postings, along with ads for their publications and various items of interest for all scales, go back to the top of their homepage and click on "Newsletters". Click on the boxes at the bottom for any of the areas of interest you have, ("Garden Railways" is one). You may like to get updates and ads from them about one of the other titles, if so, click on all that apply. Insert your email address, and click on "Sign Up". So far everything you've done is free.

But if you want unlimited access to their posted articles, and other search and download options, you will have to "Sign Up" for a Trains.com "Unlimited Digital Membership" (As they continually urge you to do) After a 30-day free trial, Unlimited Membership costs \$6.99/month, billed annually in one installment (of \$83.88).

This gets you:

All content on Trains.com from their family of brands, including the NewsWire, Product Reviews, Track Plan Database, archives of all of their magazines, some online books, and much more.

Andwhat was that? You also get a FREE TEE SHIRT when you sign up!

Possibly, sometime in the future, I might become a subscriber to this extensive service.

In the meantime, the independent *Garden Railroading News* (free at https://www.grnews.org/), supplemented by *Garden Trains Annual*, (From White River Productions) are giving me plenty of garden railroading reading. I'd like to hear from you about what you are using and would like to see.

By the way, if you got really stoked by reading about the "Grant Funk Railroad" in GR News, May-June 2021 (I did), you will be pleased to see a 33 page update and detailed "Build Log" of that railroad in the "Bonus Content" on the GR News website – all free, of course.

Also included a bundle of odds and ends of Code 220 and Code 200 track.


Nice for industrial spurs even if you are using Code 332 track.




For Sale: 55 Pairs – Kadee "One Scale" Couplers Kadee #819 Packet - \$4.00 each pair Contact Fred Weber

This stock number will come up on a search as an "O" scale draft gear box. It is apparently an old stock number that has been changed. This packet contains a pair of KADEE #1-SCALE #882 FLEX-BRACKETS & #820 #1 SCALE COUPLERS with draft gear box.

Kadee uses the #1 Scale designation to indicate that it is smaller than the couplers usually used for G scale. It is primarily for use with 1:32 rolling stock, but some use them for 1:29 or even 1:20.3 as they are actually closer to correct scale size for all of these scales than the "G"scale couplers. However, it is our experience that the larger ones work better, thus most G scalers use the larger couplers which are designated "G" scale. If you like the #1 Scale couplers, this is less than half price.

Track is like new as it was only used on my Indoor Shelf Double Loop layout that I have removed from my train room. It all fits on the 3/4" plywood corners &1x12 wood shelves that are cut to fit in a room 27' X 10' - 6". Brackets are not included. Green I/O carpet to cover the bare wood and act as a roadbed for the track all cut to size is included along with front trim to cover the front edge.

Track is all Brass, Aristocraft American Style ties and is in excellent condition. It consists of 1 full box of 9 ft diameter and 1 full box of 10 ft diameter curves.

12 pcs of 5 ft straight, 1 pc of 3 ft straight, and 3 pcs of 2 ft straight. Some pcs were cut to fit size of room.

Track is priced as total package consisting of the above and there are some extra pcs not listed that are thrown in at no cost.

All of the rest of the wood layout is included free and you will need a pickup truck to haul it as the 1X12 shelves are 16 ft long unless you want to cut them.

Price for all of the track is \$665.00 and is not being broken up.

The layout wooden shelves are free to the buyer, take it or leave it.
