LGB has introduced a new trackside control unit to complement their DCC system. They are planning the release of a wireless handheld controller, and also offer an app that allows you to use your iphone for a throttle.

A few locomotives that have recently arrived and are currently available are: Blue Goose 25T Diesel (38502), the C&S Mogul #3 (38235), and the UP Mogul #1209 (38236). There's also some models that will be arriving in May/June. These are the D&RGW Mini-Mogul #247 (38239), and a set of C&S passenger cars (38661 + 38662) + a caboose (38969)



2023 National Garden Railway Convention

Santa Clara, California

I'm sure the prospect of a 2900 mile trip to Santa Clara, (near San Francisco), put the brakes on a lot

of you for going to this convention. Still, there were at least eight of us from Florida that I knew of, and we all felt it was worth the trip, as did the some 800 others from all over the world who attended.

Patty and I started our adventure with a flight to Denver. Denver now has a dedicated rail line to wisk you from the



than trying to sleep on a "red eye" airline trip, but I wouldn't try it for anything longer than this 33 hour ride.

Most of the time we rode in the Amtrak Superliner's observation cars (called "Sightseer Lounges"), and the views while winding through the Rocky's were spectacular! If you're planning to come to the 2025 NGRC in Sacramento, I highly recommend this mode of transportation. After arriving in Berkeley, we spent two days commuting to San Francisco, riding cable cars, viewing museums, and trying to see the Golden Gate Bridge through the fog.



airport to Union Station where you can catch the Amtrak California Zephyr to San Francisco. They're running something like an updated version of the old Budd RDC's on the airport rail. A welcome contrast to the airline seats, the coach seats on the Amtrak California Zephyr are luxurious, more comfortable than ever, so we opted to sleep in them rather than climb into the bunk beds in the Pullman's. With a travel pillow and a cushion for my tush, it is definitely better




Then after a day visiting the "pre-convention" layouts in Marin County, we headed down to Santa Clara, 40 miles south of San Francisco, for the NGRC.


We opted to ride the bus for all the layout tours. As usual the bus couldn't get to all of them, but we never have when driving either. Including the pre and post-convention tours, there were over 100 layouts at this convention!

The Layouts

Scratch-built structures of stunning quality were everywhere. Many of the layouts had been built on hillsides, and a number of layouts incorporated some impressive stone landscaping and molded rocks and cliffs.




This realistic ore mine was hanging on a natural embankment and was flanked by winding trestles and canyon roadbeds with narrow gauge trains climbing the grades. Note the jitney track in the background which had strings of ore cars bringing material out of the hillside mine.



There were bridges and trestles to compliment the ambitious landscaping on many of the layouts. The layout in this picture featured amazing crafted artificial rocks and cliffs.

Other layouts had landscape formations constructed with natural boulders and gravel. This layout is a depiction of a railroad that would have run through Yellowstone National Park.



Here is the West Yellowstone Station, one of many fine scratch-built structures we saw on these tours.


Another finely crafted scratchbuilt structure on a hillside



There were several layouts with a Disney theme. This fine scratch-built model of Disneyland Main Street was one of the best. Others included a "Pirates of the Caribbean", Disneyland train station, and several layouts had diamond mines being operated by the "Seven Dwarfs".




This sawmill was on the layout of well-known garden railroader, Jack Verducci, which featured many other masterpieces of scratch-building and lifelike village scenes, shown on the following pages.



This nifty little village scene was on Jack's layout. Is that a lighthouse on top of a railroad station? I guess he has a whimsical side, as did many other layout hosts. Jack operates mostly live steam, and as you can see in this picture, his layout was designed for switching operations.




Most of the layouts featured lush forests of evergreen trees and ground cover, as well as being the shadow of full size spruce, and even some giant redwoods



We saw many astounding bridges and trestles





There were layouts of all sizes – from compact, to large. Some of the best ones were actually fairly small sized.

This layout on the left was a real jewel.

The layout below featured trains winding through Europe and Asia.

Lower right, this layout owner loved long trains, and had 30 foot diameter curves.

Directly below is a 3-rail O gauge layout. There was an outdoor On30 layout also, with HO gauge track








The innovation and originality was unimaginable.

Below, on one of the smaller layouts, you could lose yourself in the miniature forest on a hillside.



On the right is another 3-rail O gauge railroad, this one part of a train station museum housing a huge HO layout. It also tastefully incorporated G scale tracks and trains in a forced perspective motif.



The long history of garden railroading in the Bay Area was evidenced by the number of LGB Mogul locomotives and other early 'G" scale rolling stock.

There was also an abundance of unusual locos, including this 1/8 scale wood burner below on the left, and the rare G scale "Pioneer Zephyr", pictured at the bottom of the page.





And a trip to California would not be complete without a ride on the "Roaring Camp and Big Trees" Railroad! Patty and I rode it to the summit after an exciting ride through the Redwood Forrest, climbing through switchbacks on a 9.5% grade!



We hope you enjoyed this glimpse of the 2023 NGRC in California. If you'd like to see more NGRC layout pictures (I shot 2300 exposures) I'll post the best hundred or so on the FGRS website next month.

In the Newsletter next month I'll post some of the highlights of the Train Show in the Vendor Hall along with some notes about the manufacturers who set up exhibits and talked to us about their products and the future of garden railroading; and also be sure and take a look at my article about the Clinics I attended, and hear what I learned!
