Had a fantastic time at Don& Lenojo's fun run.



# **Member Spotlight**

## Richard and Barbara Oldenburg 6/1/2018

Richard and Barbara Oldenburg joined FGRS shortly after its inception in 1990, and few have been working in G scale as long as they have. Although they have also modeled in Z, N, and HO, they got the bug for the massive garden scale trains as soon as they became available. Starting with early Lionel G scale and LGB trains over 29 years ago, they decided to fill in the swimming pool after their children were grown, and built a beautiful garden railroad there.

Originally from Jersey City, New Jersey, they moved to Florida with their 2 daughters 43 years ago. When FGRS started up in the southwest area, legendary FGRS founders such as Ray and Betty Neid, Bry and Esther Parsons, and others, welcomed them, and Rich and Barbara have been members ever since. Richard fondly recalls the fun of setting up the FGRS "Trains Under the Banyans" display at Selby Botanical Gardens. In the early days of FGRS, we did those twice a year, drawing large crowds at Christmas time. He also participated in the many train show setups we did in the southwest and Tampa area. The meets at their house always included a delightful smorgasbord of traditional hot dishes, and there was always something new in the impressive G scale village in the lanai where the trains ran through.

Richard says his earliest memories of Christmas include his father and uncle setting up the huge "standard gauge" Lionel trains – larger than G scale – running around the Christmas tree. He and Barbara carried on that tradition with many train sets and layouts through the years, involving their daughters and hosting Boy Scout merit badge programs.

Richard served in the Navy during the Korean war, and then worked in the food packing machinery industry, both in New Jersey and Florida. He eventually owned his own business maintaining machinery for the food producing industry. Now 81, Richard and Barbara are celebrating their 60<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary

this year. Living with Parkinson's disease since 2003, Richard was determined not to let it stop him from enjoying life. With Barbara's arduous support, he has been able to live a very active life, and continues to get out on the lanai and run the trains almost every day.

This is a GP38-2 by USA TRAINS. I did all of the following myself.

Installed airwire G3X, placed a 4500 mah battery from Cordeless Renovations.

Phoenix sound, I also put ditch lights on the front and rear as all yard engines have this configuration. The ditch lights alternate when the bell or horn is pressed. I also replaced all the axles and wheels it does not have the traction tires anymore I used the regular wheel set. This was necessary because USA TRAINS had a problem with the axels being split from the factory. Now this engine runs smooth as can be. Kadee couplers were also added. It also can run on track power and still have all the functionality that is offered through the airwire Tx. Any questions call or e-mail.

It is offered at \$700.00 pretty firm because that's what I have into it. I spent about 30 hours from out of the box to finished product. My labor is free to any FGRS member. Enjoy the pics. Here are two videos of the engine in action.




