



MEETS AT MEMBERS HOUSES

April 28th - Fun Run at Tom & Gloria's House. Located at 23379 Superior Ave Port Charlotte. The Tropical RR hours will be 12:00 to 4:00. Bring your own lunch. Soda and water will be provided. The TRR has 400' of main line track with 20' diameter curves so bring on the Big Boys. The switching yard has 7 tracks for plenty of storage. All switches are #6. Battery power only.

May 19th - Fun Run at Don & Lenojo Carter 's their Silver River Railroad will be operation from 11:00 AM – 4:00PM

Under construction since 2000.. Almost done...(never)

The host will provide paper products, water, sodas, tables and a few chairs. Please bring a dish to share. You are welcome to bring something to run. I do track power (Bridgeworks 10 &15 amp power) double track with smallest curves are 10' outside & 8' inside radius.

The layout [G scale Trains] is out doors and covers 1,300' of track over 1/2 acre. There is a 30' oval pond 100' stream and 8' bog. The freight yard is in one bay of the two car barn garage. The town "Silver River" is based on the early 1950's.

The address is:

6130 NE 3rd. Place Ocala, Fl.

(Just one mile from Silver Springs @ SR40 and SR35)

Directions from Ocala visa I75, US 441, 301, 27:

Take SR 40 East. This is the road to Silver Springs, to NE 7 Street, just past Ocala Golf Club.

Turn right.

Go East on NE 7th Street to Baseline Rd, (SR 35). (about 2 miles)

Cross over Baseline RD. and go one long block to NE 61 Terrace. (Green Ridge Acres)

Turn right off NE 7th Street onto NE 61 Terrace. Go to the top of the hill to NE 3 Place. Turn right on NE 3 Place. Go to the end of the street and park. (Short block dead end)

The trains are behind the white fence.

Look for the R/R sign's

Look forward to seeing you all.



At the recent 37th National Narrow Gauge Convention held in Denver, a kitbashed 1/20 Bachmann 3-truck Shay I built won two awards in the model contest. While it was 3rd overall in the geared locomotive class (against some fierce 1/20 competition), it also was awarded one of two H. Lee Riley memorial awards from Bachmann trains. Bachmann made a similar, matching award in O scale. I was very happy and grateful to win those awards.

Here are some pix. The model is somewhat unusual, in that it is now 1-1/2" to the foot (or 1/8th scale) so it's a lot, lot bigger overall than the out of the box Shay. Some 1/20 parts remain, but not many. It still runs on Ga 1 track, but with the re-scaling the track now only represents 14" in the new scale - like a miniature, estate or light industrial loco. I stripped the chassis down to the deck first and then "puffed" it up to 1/8 scale from there. The loco's deck was "laminated" with larger pilots and scale decking first, and I raised the boiler about 3/4" so it would be easier for a larger figure to reach the fire box door. The OEM cab was removed and the small water tank above the middle truck was split and converted to cab sides. A new roof had to be made, and I like the open style on this model. A raised wood load was added to help cover the electronics in the 3rd truck / tender. The model is pretty big compared to G stuff, but only 18' x 5ft x 9ft tall in scale - a baby shay, really. Keep in mind a scale person in 1/8th is 9" tall - shorter than a GI Joe, but a LOT bigger than a 1/20 figure. I'll bring it to the next meet I make for show n tell. Gary
