9:30AM til 1PM.



# <u>Palmetto Train Show – February 18 – 19</u>

The FGRS display was a huge success. We attracted lots of folks to a train show otherwise almost devoid of any garden railroading displays.

First, let me thank Tim Smith and Jennifer who modified modules from their patio layout to interface with the FGRS style modules built by Tom Hite. Tom's modules featured railroad block signals, operating crossing gates, and street-corner traffic signals. These were all controlled by a custom electronic console designed and built by Tom, utilizing



seven Arduino processor modules, with appropriate interface LED driver modules, all triggered by laser track sensors from Model Train Technology Co. who also manufactured the signals and crossing gates.

Tom ran his RDC car and a CSX Geep pulling a tanker train, both controlled with a Railpro wireless system with sound, and he gave passers by the chance to try their hand at controlling the trains with it. Paul ran his "Crescent Limited" Southern Railway Pacific with a heavyweight passenger train, controlled with a legacy Airwire system.



We also set up a new layout built by Don Carter which was equally as entertaining, running two trains which were especially interesting to the youngsters. Bill Wolle took responsibility for that layout, and gave kids a chance to run trains with the Bridgemasters powerpacks we had on hand. Bill ran his finely crafted wooden freight train which drew a great deal of attention.





Tim Smith gave clinics on the new battery/control system, "Blunami", showing off the electronic modules and running an engine equipped with the system, which includes a robust sound system.

Also a big thank you to Richard Bliven and Patty Wagner who interfaced with the visitors to our display, and pitched in with the set-up and tear down of the display.
