

We had some storm shutters left from some renovations, amd they cover 2 tracks. I added 8" 2 x 4's on each corner, and a short piece of 1 x 1 on each corner to hold them off the track. <u>A New Loco for Lakes Park</u>

FGRS member Tim Smith is a regular volunteer at the Railroad Museum of South Florida at Lakes Park in Ft Myers, and has taken a great interest in the ride-on railroad there. Operating as Lakes Park and Gulf Railroad, the 1/8th scale trains run on a 7.5 inch gauge track that takes riders for about a mile-long ride around a lake, through the north end of the park with bridges over some waterways, and past many interesting miniature scenes.

When Tim learned that one of their gasoline powered "Geeps" was going to be replaced, he began looking around for alternatives to the old technology. At about that time, John and Katy

Abbott, also FGRS members, were downsizing their collection of 7.5 inch gauge engines, and offered a battery powered "steam" mogul to the park at a reasonable price. Tim brought the parties together, and the deal was closed! John and Katy were so pleased that the engine would have a good new home, and went to great effort to deliver the engine to Lakes Park. They even assisted in getting it on the tracks and began training the Park's engineers in its operation.

They've got the loco unloaded here – now we just need the tender!

It was an exciting day for everyone at the Park, and several other FGRS members showed up for the unloading and the inaugural run on the railroad. Bill and Diane Severns came out and took the photos you see here. Marv Koenig and Pete Thornton also came out to lend a hand.

This engine, the park's first with battery power, will be added to their fleet of passenger carrying locomotives.



They have already been using it for three runs per day, and will gradually increase that until they are confident the batteries will support the full day of passenger pulling, typical sixteen runs. It can be fitted with new Lithium-Ion batteries at a very low cost, which should more than double the run time.
